OVERVIEW
AND
OBJECTIVES**

- Marking Period 1: De Compras: Talk about clothing/shopping preference, discuss clothing fit and price, exchange info. about activities that occurred in the past, exchange opinions about clothing items.
- Marking Period 2: La Rutina Diaria: Discuss daily routines, write an ad for a product or a store, Describe a personal experience of a place that you visited.
- Marking Period 3: La Comida: Talk about some common foods and nutritional value, eating habits. Learn to order food in a restaurant, describe events, compare people and places.
- Marking Period 4: En el consultorio: Discuss symptoms and medicines, describe childhood and past events, ask and answer questions about frequency of events.

**CLASSROOM
EXPECTATIONS
AND
PROCEDURES**

- **Be Respectful** Respect others' personal space and property as well as the classroom. Use appropriate language for a classroom.

Using Google Translate to translate your sentences or paragraphs is considered ***cheating***.

- Your grades will go up or down depending on your performance in classwork, assessments, and class participation. You earn your grades with your hard work. Complete all work to the best of your ability and in a timely manner for the best grade possible.

MAKEUP WORK:

- If you are absent, it is your responsibility to talk to me as soon as you return in order to schedule a make-up of any missed assessments. The missed assessments must be completed within five days of your return. After that time the missing grade becomes a zero.
- You must make up all assignments you missed while absent. After your return to school, you will be allowed one day per each day of absence to complete the missing work.

PARTICIPATION:

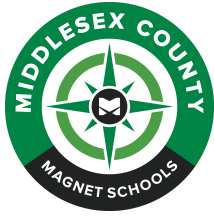
