2018: Year in Review

2018 was one of the wildest and most chaotic years in recent history. The past 12 months have been marred by events which strengthened international bonds, revealed the inner evil present in certain individuals, and left many questioning about their futures. Here's a look at some of the most influential and noteworthy events of 2018:

US Government Shutdown - January 20th to 22th

Ever since the election of President Trump, the US government has become constantly more unstable, due mostly to the lack of significant party majority in the Senate and the House. This particular shutdown was the result of the Senate unable to overcome a democratic filibuster (an attempt at delaying the passing of a bill) regarding the revision of DACA policies. The filibuster was so successful that it stalled the passing of legislation to fund government operations and agencies. The shutdown finally ended when Democrats caved into Republican demands, resuming government operations the following Monday.

Winter Olympics in PyeongChang - February 9th to 25th

The 2018 Winter Olympics was arguably the worst US showing in the 21st century. The US won a record low 23 medals in PyeongChang. The low medal count was mainly attributed to olympian Apolo Ohno's retirement, and hopefully

the US can make a comeback at the 2022 olympics in Beijing. The more interesting development was the tension between South Korea and North Korea present during the games. Surprisingly, South Korea allowed North Korean athletes to participate, with some speculating the two neighboring enemies to be "warming up" to each other.

Castro Rule Ends in Cuba - February 24th

The Castro family has controlled the presidency of Cuba for nearly 60 years, beginning in the 1960s with Fidel Castro.

Therefore, the international community was ecstatic to hear that current president Raul Castro would be stepping down from power by the end of February. This should result in Cuba forming

much stronger international bonds, as the rest of the world was not thrilled with Cuba being led by Castro after Castro (to say the least).

Surprisingly, Cubans seem quite indifferent to this transition. Most seem to think that their new president will not bring any tangible added benefits to the country.



Voting in Iraq - May 15th

Following the recent overthrow of ISIS, Iraqis finally regained the power to vote, and the first legislative and provincial election were held in over a decade. Notable with these elections is that Iraqis allowed women to vote, thus ending the gender difference instated by ISIS and traditionalist views. Hopefully these elections point to the beginning of a more politically open and westernized Middle East, once again making it a safe and flourishing area.

World Cup - June 14th to July 15th

The 2018 FIFA world cup brought a nice distraction to the political issues that ravaged the world, and it did not disappoint. Many matches resulted in unexpected outcomes, such as the qualifying match between South Korea and Germany, and who could forget England vs. Croatia, arguably the most hyped match of the entire cup. In the end, France won for a second time, exactly 20 years before its previous win.



Tham Luang Cave Rescue - June 23rd to July 10th

On June 23rd, a Thai soccer team consisting of 4 boys ages 11-17 (plus their coaches) were stranded in a cave due to monsoon flooding.

With the team nearly a mile underground, and their only exit blocked by water, their chances for survival seemed very slim. Nonetheless, a search team was able to locate the team, and was surprised to learn that all boys and adults were perfectly healthy. After an international rescue effort, the entire team successfully exited the cave with no casualties or even major injuries. Everyone thankfully made a quick recovery.

Senate Midterms - November 6th

The recent Senate midterm elections were projected to indicate voter opinion regarding the last year and a half of Trump's presidency. If this is true, then voters are extremely unhappy with the president. The turnout from the midterms can best be described as a "blue tsunami," with democrats taking back the seats they lost to republicans 2 years prior. However, neither party has a true majority in the Senate, and we can therefore expect legislation to continue being delayed in the recent future.

COP24 Summit - December 4th

Global warming is the biggest environmental issue on everyone's mind, and it now seems as if world leaders will finally be making a decision regarding the future of the Earth's climate. Held in Poland, countries will finally be forced to enforce the Paris accords put into place years prior, which state acceptable levels of pollution and the steps governments must take to limit carbon emissions. Elon Musk's 2018

When people think of Elon Musk, they often think of an innovative leader, one who has single-handedly affected the lives of many and has made the world a much better place today. Musk has a proven track record when it comes to success and has founded numerous major corporations, including PayPal, SolarCity, SpaceX, Tesla, and Neuralink to name a few. But while Musk may have a reputation for success, a lot changed in 2018.

Tesla Going Private

On August 7, 2018, Elon Musk tweeted, "Am considering taking Tesla private at \$420. Funding secured." Shortly after, the Tesla stock price fell by 7% and led to an investigation. In addition, Musk's net worth dropped by about \$500 million dollars. On August 10, Musk faced lawsuits from two Tesla investors who filed lawsuits which accused Musk of manipulating investors and Tesla's stock price. To make matters worse, the US Securities and Exchange Commission charged Musk with fraud for his tweets. The charges were later settled, however, and the Tesla stock jumped 5% shortly after.

Autopilot Controversy

While the Tesla Autopilot Feature may be one of Tesla vehicle's selling points, it also comes with a significant amount of risk, as demonstrated on May 20, 2018, when a Tesla driver died with the Autopilot feature on. Wei Huang, the driver of the Model X, had reportedly ignored multiple warnings from the vehicle but did not take any action, thus resulting in the vehicle crashing into a concrete highway divider. This crash sent

Tesla's Autopilot program back multiple steps and was financially costly for the company as well.



Musk vs. Media

2018 also began Musk's battle with the media. Often, Musk took to Twitter to express his discontent with the media. To date, Musk has lashed out against CNBC, Reuters, and many other news organizations. More specifically, Musk was enraged by the fact that Tesla vehicles were often scrutinized and criticized. "It's super messed up that a Tesla crash resulting in a broken ankle is front page news and the ~40,000 people who died in US auto accidents alone in past year get almost no coverage."

Hyperloop

Though the Hyperloop has often been ridiculed for being a dangerous and unrealistic idea, it has finally become a reality today. The Hyperloop is a mode of transportation which relies on pressurized tunnels to transport passengers in speeds of up to 760 miles per hour. The Hyperloop concept has been characterized as "open-source," and was introduced by

Musk in 2012. Today, Hyperloop construction has already begun and is being introduced across the nation.

Falcon Heavy Liftoff

Considered to be one of the most powerful rockets ever created, the Falcon Heavy rocket lifted off from Cape Canaveral on February 6. This rocket is important because it is a partially reusable heavy-lift launch vehicle and represents an iconic move in the space industry. The successful liftoff of this rocket can be considered one of Musk's greatest successes in 2018 and cemented his legacy in space exploration.

YouTube Rewind

Unless you've been living under a rock for the past few weeks, you've probably watched or at least heard about the most recent YouTube Rewind. Most notably, you've heard about all the hate it has been getting, and you may even be one of those haters yourself. Astonishingly (yet perhaps not surprisingly), the video has quickly become the most disliked video in all of YouTube's history, but this begs the question: why? And more importantly, what does it indicate about the real way YouTube has changed over the past few years?

The largest problem people have sighted with this year's Rewind is simply that it is absolutely not representative of the YouTube audience or culture of 2018. What's so ironic about this is how the video is subtitled as "Everyone Controls Rewind," and someone in the video literally says, "let's give the people what they want," yet the final product is far from what people really hoped to see. As the comment section indicates, most people are already aware of and angry about Rewind 2018's underrepresentation, but why is this the case? It's not like YouTube hates their audience. After all, it's what they need to thrive as a business. However, like any business ever, what YouTube also needs is money, and the main way they get this is through advertisements. However, since the aptly dubbed "Adpocalypse" of 2017, where several companies pulled their

8 ads from YouTube because they were being aired on "inappropriate" videos, YouTube has

come down hard on creators in an effort to preserve their image and keep the site safe. Sadly, this has led to some creators struggling to make revenue off of their videos and, of course, YouTube cutting ties with any creator who is associated with a hint of inappropriate or controversial content. This is the real reason why YouTube is so afraid to feature many creators in its more recent Rewinds: they simply can't risk coming off as "unsafe" or "insensitive" to the outside world.

But YouTube wasn't always like this. YouTube Rewind 2013 was one of the most cherished Rewinds ever, with the reason being that it felt more wholesome, less pandering, and much more indicative of the culture at the time. They used to be a lot more dedicated to the people on the site, but now, with YouTube becoming more and more corporate, and with disastrous events like the subscription box algorithm change and the Logan Paul controversy, a large gap has grown between YouTube and its audience. This is the real issue behind the 2018 Rewind, an issue which perfectly sums up how YouTube has changed over the past few years. Of course, nobody can really blame YouTube for wanting to appear more safe and family-friendly, but at what cost does such a change come with? Sure, YouTube is a business, but I think we can all agree that such a large disconnect and feeling of hatred between them and their viewers will not help their cause in the long run.

Will YouTube learn something from this Rewind? Only time will tell, and right now all we can do is hope that YouTube listens to its audience, while we remain shaking our heads and trying our hardest to wipe the image of Trevor Noah and John Oliver doing Fortnite dances out of our brains.

SPORTS COLUMN

The month of December continues to entice and excite sports fan across the nation as the National Basketball Association (NBA) and National Football League (NFL) are in full-swing.

With the NFL's 16-game regular season winding down, 13 teams have been officially eliminated from playoff while 5 teams have clinched a playoff spot. That leaves 14 hopeful teams who will be fighting during their last two games for the final 7 postseason spots. One team that is fighting for a postseason appearance in the American Football Conference (AFC) is the Cleveland Browns. Coming as a surprise to many, the Browns, who went 0-16 last year, have managed to achieve a 5-7-1 record thus far into the season. If the Browns can defy all odds and other pieces fall into place (CBS Sports put their odds to make the playoffs at less than 1%), it would be the first time any NFL team makes the playoffs following a 0-16 season.



Moving to the NFC, the Chicago Bears (10-4) have clinched the NFC North for the first time since 2010. Powered by quarterback Mitchell Trubisky and linebacker Khalil Mack, the Bears are a force to reckon with in the NFC. Unfortunately, both the New York Jets and New York Giants have been eliminated from the postseason. The next for these two teams is to finish the regular season strong and deliberate any roster changes for the 2019 NFL Draft.

Moving away from the gridiron and onto the hardwood, the NBA regular season, which is now one-third complete, has seen action at a whole new level. Every team in the NBA has been averaging more points per game compared to their totals last year, hinting at an elevated level of play as well as a more dynamic game with more 3-pt shots being attempted every game. The biggest surprise of the NBA season so far may be the Eastern Conference. The Boston Celtics and Philadelphia 76ers, who were projected to be fighting for the #1 seed in the East, are currently sitting as the 4th and 5th



seeds. The Toronto Raptors, powered by new acquisition Kawhi Leonard, are leading the NBA with a league best record of 23-9. The Western Conference has also seen much shock with the Denver Nuggets de-throning the Golden State Warriors as the West's best team. This regular season so far has also been a great year for rookies; Luka Doncic of the Dallas Mavericks has lit the league on fire by leading all rookies in scoring and points-per-game.

As 2018 winds down, what better way to close off the year than exhilarating NBA and NFL games! Happy holidays!

Holidays in the City

The lady sighed and shook her head once the man was out of sight. "I'm sorry you had to go through that. Many people are still not... cooperative with your kind."


