GOOGLE STADIA: A REVOLUTION IN GAMING?

Recently, Google has unveiled more details about their upcoming system: Google Stadia. But what exactly is Stadia, and is it worth all the hype? Some are excited to see what the new program will bring to the table come launch in November of this year, while others are skeptical of its success.

Stadia is video game streaming service, deviating from the typical consoles and PCs that the community has grown used to in the past two decades. The best way to describe it is that it's like Netflix for gaming, with the only difference being that users pay for specific games, not a full subscription (aside from premium services like Stadia Pro). While this is not a completely new idea for the gaming industry, it is the first streaming service in gaming to really gain some ground. Games are streamed from Google's data centers directly to TVs, desktops, laptops, tablets, and smartphones, with no downloads or installs necessary. Pretty much any device that can access Google Chrome will be able to stream games at launch through Stadia.


The ambitious scope of the project has left some users skeptical of its feasibility and ease-of-implementation. While Google has clarified a lot of originally unanswered details since they originally announced Stadia at the Game Developers Conference in



March, there are still some aspects leaving potential buyers uneasy.

One of these concerns is speed. In order to actually play or *control* games through Stadia, your Stadia controller and device of choice need considerably, and at that point, users may as well go back to playing on a console or PC that they know is reliable.

Additionally, while Stadia boasts *some* popular game titles like *Tom*



to communicate with Google's data center, where the games are streamed from. Google boasts that it can still supply games with at least 720p video at 60 frames per second to users with a less than ideal Internet connection. However, Google may underestimate just how many of its users have access to a strong signal. If the Internet connection users have is not sufficient, games will lag *Clancy's The Division 2, Destiny 2*, and *Doom Eternal*, there does not seem to be enough to really hook users on the system, at least compared to the traditional consoles. Perhaps more, less-obscure titles will be added in the future, but for now, users really only have a choice between a few highly-rated titles.

Despite some setbacks, there is no doubt that Stadia has stacked up to be a worthy challenger to consoles like the Xbox One and PS4. In fact, Microsoft and Sony announced a partnership last month largely due to the announcement of Stadia. Both companies are working toward their own streaming services, but they still want to keep the video game industry console realm, which is their traditional wheelhouse. Considering how the two tech giants are typically seen as bitter rivals, it's clear that Stadia will provide some hefty competition.

All in all, Google Stadia has certainly excited many gamers, even those who are used to the traditional console and PC realm of video games. Streaming games will transform the video game industry in the coming years, and it will be interesting to see just how good of a job Stadia does at paving the way for the future to come.





THE 30TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE TIANANMEN PROTESTS

\$1000 MAC PRO STAND

Apple's WWDC 2019 keynote gave us a refresh on a long-waiting desktop, a new version of Apple's new Mac Pro. With the announcement, Apple introduced a few costly accessories.

First, the company announced a \$5000 retina display. With it's

18,000,000 plus pixels and 1000000:1 contrast ratio, the price of the monitor was somewhat reasonable, especially when looking at Apple's track record. However, the statement that came after shocked potentially interested customers.

It would be charging \$1000 for

their pro stand and mount adapter. Though the stand has premium features expected from Apple like a portrait mode, the price was hardly justified by the presentation at WWDC. The technology community was outraged following the event, calling

Apple aimed to sell this machine to people who could afford it to take advantage of everything its computer had to offer. In other words, it is ideal for professionals and corporations willing to roll out t tens of thousands for the best of the best such as 8k video editing and other intensive workloads. Still, for an item that is included in the box in high-end monitors, Apple seems to be taking every opportunity to squeeze cash out of its faithful customers.

Apple has steadily raised the cost of its products, and those loyal to the Apple ecosystem have paid the premium for it. Now, the firm seems to think that it can get away with anything, including pricing a monitor stand for more than their entry-level iPhone.



PIXEL 4: GOOGLE'S ATTEMPT AT THE PERFECT SMARTPHONE

Overview

Although it has only been a few months since the Pixel 3 and 3 XL were released, Google is supposedly finalizing the details regarding its next major smartphone release: the Pixel 4 + 4 XL. The phones coincide with the release of Android Q, the next iteration of Google's popular mobile operating system. Of course, with a supposed release in October, you can bet there are plenty of rumors regarding the Pixel 4. Here's a look at what we can expect to see from Google in a couple of months, and whether they are worth taking a look at.



Specs

The Pixel 4 is likely to have mostly the same specs as other Android smartphones this year. This means we can expect to see:

- Dual front camera
- Punch-hole camera
- Single rear camera with software enhancements
- In-display fingerprint sensor
- Qualcomm Snapdragon 855
- Increased RAM
- Increased storage
- No microSD support
- No 3.5 mm headphone jack
- Android Q

Design

The Pixel 4 series looks likely to sport a notched display – a very different approach to the Galaxy S10-esque cut-out for the selfie camera revealed in another leak published last month. With any luck, it'll be a little smaller than the humongous notch on the Pixel 3 XL, which was mocked by rival Samsung at launch.

Speaking of eyesores, the high-resolution renders reveal an all-new rear camera design for the Pixel 4 that will seemingly take up a large portion of the back panel. Unlike previous Pixel branded smartphones, which Google always insisted could achieve the same effect with a single lens – lossless zoom, portrait mode images, strong low-light performance - that other manufacturers required a secondary (or third, or fourth) camera match. Now, it seems Google will increase the number of lenses fitted to its handset for the first time.

Pricing

Given the growing price of flagship smartphones, we can expect the Pixel 4 to be very expensive. It's possible it might even cost more than \$1000 (a first for Google). However, its also likely Google will release a cheaper, stepped-down version of the Pixel 4 with less features. This might have a slower

16 processor, less RAM, and a smaller

battery, similar to the the Pixel 3a. Regardless, the Pixel 4 is expected to be cheaper than the upcoming iPhone from Apple, and its price tag might attract other Android users looking for a more to-the-roots smartphone.



JURASSIC PARK ERUPTS IN CANADA
