


Creating an annotated bibliography in Noodletools

1. You will follow the usual steps for citing. See other handouts if needed.
2. The field for entering your annotations is located at the bottom of each citation that you create.


Example #1: adding an annotation to a previously created citation:

1. Go to “Sources.”
2. Click on the blue “options” button for the citation you are adding an annotation to.
3. Click on “edit.”
